




Basis of Faith

These directions includes all aspects of our life, including belief, worship, relationships, dealings, manners, relationships, sexuality age and gender.


In regards to relationships, Al Siraat college aligns itself on matters of sexuality and gender with the that are unambiguously established in the Quran, the teachings of the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) and scholarly tradition spanning fourteen centuries.

SCHOLARLY CONSENSUS

In Islam, the only accepted forum for sexual relations are between a husband and wife and the only form of legitimate marriage is between a man and a woman. Islam views gender as binary: man and woman.

O mankind! We have created you from a male and female, and made you into nations and tribes, that you may know one another (Hujurat 49:14 part)	

Islam rejects premarital and extramarital sexual acts and other sexual orientations as evidenced in the Quran, Sunnah and Scholarly Consensus

Do not go near fornication. It is truly an immoral deed and a terrible way (Isra: 17:32)	

IDENTITY

Al Siraat College recognises that some groups have reinterpreted or revised religious doctrine to be inclusive of LGBTQ ideology. Our Islamic School does not accept this and solely aligns itself with the Scholarly Consensus.

1. In line with the Scholarly Consensus, Al Siraat College recognises that Islam distinguishes between feelings, actions and identity, in that God holds individuals accountable for their words and actions (and not their involuntary thoughts and feelings). As is mentioned in the hadith of "....." 8 U.....
2. In Islam, abstinence from unlawful sexual activity is mandated.
3. According to the Scholarly Consensus Al Siraat College follows, Islam does not allow for the otherwise unless individuals are born with biological ambiguities or disorders of sexual development.
4. Islam differentiates between the public and private sphere, but also prohibits the public disclosure of sexual behaviour. Al Siraat College concerns itself with the realm of staff conduct which can impact its students in the classroom, elsewhere on campus, on the internet, or in other settings. Al Siraat College will not interfere with private lifestyle choices, so long as they do not interfere with the inherent requirement of a staff member to uphold the religious ethos and teachings of the college.
